HEALTH HISTORY FORM

Registration is not complete until your child has a completed and signed Health History Form on file at the YMCA prior to the first day of camp. This form provides important information to camp staff regarding the health and wellness of your child; for example: authorized adults who can pick-up your child, important contact phone numbers and any medical needs that staff should be aware of.

THIRD PARTY PAYMENT POLICY

Families that receive subsidy from another agency are still required to register children at the YMCA and submit all necessary paperwork as well as pay the deposit for each camp week. (See 3rd Party Payment Contract) For all payments that the agency denies, parents will be required to make all necessary payments. YMCA will refund deposits after the 3rd Party Agency has paid the YMCA in full.

LATE PICK UPS

All children not picked up by the end of camp day will be assessed the late fee of \$1.00 for every minute, due to additional staff support needed to supervise a child beyond their scheduled shift. All charges are due at time of pick up or before your child returns to camp

FINANCIAL AID

Mini Coding Dojo (K-2nd):

Using iPad/Asus Tablet applications like Scratch Jr, Kodable, Light bot, and Bloxels coupled with hands on board games that promote social problem-solving, Code Fu's TK-2 Dojo teaches students the computational logic of Computer Science/ coding as well as provides them with an introduction into a number of block based coding languages. We focus on creating advanced applications and games which will provide students with an introduction into computational logic skills and basic programming languages.
