OAKLAND YMCA CAMP BASICS

HEALTH HISTORY FORM

Registration is not complete until your child has a completed and signed **the attached Health History Form** prior to the first day of camp. This form provides important information to camp staff regarding the health and wellness of your child; for example: authorized adults who can pick up your child, important contact information and any medical needs that staff should be aware.

THIRD PARTY PAYMENT POLICY

Families that receive subsidy from another agency are still required to register children at the YMCA and submit all necessary paperwork as well as pay the deposit for each camp week. (See 3rd Party Payment Contract) For all payments that the agen-cy denies, parents will be required to make all necessary payments. YMCA will refund deposits after the 3rd Party Agency has paid the YMCA in full.

FINANCIAL AID

Families that receive subsidy from another agency are still required to register children at the YMCA and submit all necessary paperwork as well as pay the deposit for each camp week. (See 3rd Party Payment Contract) For all payments that the agency denies, parents will be required to make all necessary payments. YMCA will refund deposits after the 3rd Party Agency has paid the YMCA in full.

SPECIAL NEEDS

At the Y, we aim to promote an inclusive environment where children can learn and develop in a happy, caring, and educational environment. At Y camp locations campers participate in highly active games, hikes and other physical activities. Generally the Y is unable to meet the needs of a child who requires a greater ratio than one staff to twelve campers. These needs include social, emotional, cognitive, language, and/ or motor development growth. Decisions are made on a per case basis. If during the aca-demic year your child needs additional wrap around support, TSS, and other support then your child may not be ready for the outdoor day camp .ln addition, the high levels of activity, camper and nature's noises, varying schedule of activities and routines with different campers each week may be indicators to consider that your child is not ready for camp. For further questions please schedule a time to consult with a YMCA professional to talk more about camp BEFORE registration and enrollment.

LATE PICK UPS

All children not picked up by the end of camp day will be assessed a late fee of \$1 for every minute, due to additional staff support needed to supervise child beyond scheduled shift. All charges are due at time of pick up or before your child returns to camp.

TRANSFER OF CLASSES

Transfers must be requested in writing 6 days or more before a program begins. NO TRANSFERS will be granted after this time period. Transfers must be given to the appropriate Program Director. Transfers will be granted based on availability and director approval. This applies to transfers within a specific program area only (from one swim lesson to another, from one dance class to another, etc.). Transfers from one program area to another will require approval and may not be granted.

REFUND POLICY

Refunds will be granted if requested 6 days or more prior to the start of the session. No refunds will be granted after this time period. A refund processing fee will be applied as follows: \$10 for a credit card refund, \$25 for a check or cash payment refund.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Financial assistance is available to help make YMCA programs and services available to people of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds. Funds are made available by generous individuals who donate to our Annual Campaign. The YMCA will grant financial assistance to the extent that funds are available.
